### Q3. Family physician/ general practitioner with a specified special focus to practice.

Among all family physicians: Among family physicians/general practitioners with a special focus to their practice, the most frequently indicated foci were: Emergency medicine (24%), Geriatric medicine (9%), Obstetrics (9%), Palliative care (7%), Anesthesiology (5%), Psychiatry (4%), Sports medicine (3%), Psychotherapy (3%), Addiction medicine (3%), Occupational medicine (3%), Hospitalist care (3%).

### Q3. Physician working exclusively in a specified non-clinical setting.

Among all Family Physicians: Among physicians working exclusively in a non-clinical setting, they most frequently indicated: Administration (26%), Community medicine/public health (20%), consultant (16%) and Occupational medicine (11%).
