Residents' practice patterns

Second-year family medicine residents in Canada were asked about their practice plans for the 2 to 3 years after they complete their residency training (Figure 1).

The 2004 National Physician Survey (NPS) is a unique collaborative project of the College of Family Physicians of Canada, the Canadian Medical Association, and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. National-level estimates based on 2004 NPS results are considered accurate to within $\pm 6.5\%$, 19 times out of
